I would like to take this opportunity to thank a number of our parents and community members for show care and compassion for our students out of school. Parents have stopped to ask students whether they are okay as well as reporting incidents to the school where a student has been hurt or where a student has been involved in irresponsible behaviour outside of school. By reporting these incidents, we are able to call parents and report these incidents to them. These parents have been very appreciative of this information and it helps to keep our students and community safe. So thank you for showing this level of care for our school community.

ASSIST Network

Our school has chosen to be a pert of the ASSIST network. This network has been established with Griffith University, and has been formed to support the work of schools in dealing with students experiencing trauma. A number of staff attended the network meeting from 7.00-800am last Wednesday week to hear a number of experts talk about the sort of teaching practices that can be used to support these students. I commend these teachers on giving of their time to attend this professional learning session and in being willing to go the extra mile in supporting students.

Functional Behaviour Training

Seven staff from our school, including our leadership team, behaviour teacher and some of our aspiring leaders attended a professional learning session on Thursday regarding Functional Behaviour. The same staff will also be attending a follow up session on Thursday week. This training is aimed at focusing on the reason/s for student behaviours and looking to teach replacement behaviours, which still enable a student to achieve the behavioural purpose in a more responsible way.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- · formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- · consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 2021 Queensland Engagement and Wellbeing Survey Information for parents and carers

Why are we doing the survey?

We know that wellbeing and engagement are important parts of your child's life at school. The department and your school are looking at ways to collect information on these important areas so we can support our students in the best way possible.

The Queensland Engagement and Wellbeing (QEW) Survey is designed to measure how state school students view their wellbeing and engagement.

Results from this survey will tell us about students' levels of wellbeing and engagement. This information will allow us to better support our students and meet their needs.

When will the survey take place?

In 2021, the QEW Survey will take place between these dates:

Your child's school will choose a date within this period that suits them best.

Monday 31 May to Friday 25 June, 2021

What is the survey about?

The survey measures many aspects of students' wellbeing, engagement, and experience at school.



What is involved in participation?

Teachers will arrange for students to take part in the Survey online during class time. It will take about 30 minutes to complete. If your child requires additional assistance, teachers and/or support people are able to assist them.

Does your child have to participate?

Participation in the survey is voluntary. Choosing not to participate will not affect your child's education in any way.

Your child will also be asked if they would like to participate before starting the survey. They will be free to stop or withdraw at any time.

If you do not wish for your child to participate in the QEW Survey, please contact

Your child will still get a link to the survey in their email even if you opt-out, but they won't be able to get into the survey without the access code given only at the time of completing the survey.

How will your child's information be kept confidential?

The information collected through the survey will be kept confidential. No personal information will be shared with anyone outside of the Queensland Department of Education. The Queensland Department of Education will store the data according to strict guidelines. The collection of information is in line with the Educational General Provisions Act (2006) and the Information Privacy Act (2009).

How will your child's responses be reported?

Student's answers will be de-identified. They will only be reported back to the school as part of their year levels' results. No one at your child's school will be able to see their individual responses.
